### Sean Dorsey Dance's new At-Home Season unveils 'The Lost Art of Dreaming' project

Sean Dorsey Dance's 2021 At-Home Season brings a first look at the company's new multiyear project, titled "The Lost Art of Dreaming," to personal screens starting Friday, April 16.

It is a dance film project that "expansively imagines trans and queer futures, disrupting long-entrenched American constructs that deny the space to dream about our own futures," according to Dorsey. The virtual event, available to stream through Sunday, April 18, consists of

nine video postcard films shot outdoors in the Bay Area. Locations include Bernal Hill, Warm Water Cove, Goat Hill and Bair Island Wildlife Refuge.

The second part of “The Lost Art of Dreaming” is scheduled to premiere in June during the virtual Fresh Meat Festival. Dorsey, a 2020 Doris Duke Artist, Dance/USA fellow and five-time Isadora Duncan Award winner, is known for his work as a social-practice artist who works with communities on projects over extended periods.
